*The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwell in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.* – Isaiah 9:2



Are you shining the light of Jesus in the shopping mall, grocery line, or (dare I say it) when you're stuck in traffic or pressed for time?

My prayer for you and for me today, is that Christ's light will shine brightly in us not just today but every day. As Christ's light penetrates through the darkness of our selfishness, our wants, and our own agendas, we reflect Christ and bring Him much glory.

So, let's talk through this for a moment ... What are some ways that we can shine God's light into a lost and dying world? Here are a few ideas.
